




Agricultural Practices



Ecological

- Cover crops and green manure
- Burial of plant residues and ramial chipped wood
- Polyculture
- Manual weed management (hoeing, scraping)
- Drip irrigation
- Use of manure and compost
- Use of Bordeaux mixture and sulfur
- Natural hedges

Specific to market gardening:

- Some of the seeds are reproduced on the farm
- Crop rotation and mixed cropping
- Application of algae biostimulants
- Manual work




Conventional
